#### ORDINANCE NO. 01-1002

AN ORDINANCE OF BIG SKY COUNTY WATER & SEWER DISTRICT NO. 363, MONTANA, GRANTING THE PETITION OF YELLOWSTONE CLUB TO ADD LAND TO THE DISTRICT; REFERRING THE ORDINANCE TO A VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE DISTRICT AND THE ELECTORS OF THE PROPOSED ADDITION AND REQUESTING THAT A MAIL BALLOT ELECTION BE HELD THEREON

BE IT ordained by the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the Big Sky Water & Sewer District No. 363, Montana (the "District") as follows:

### Section 1. Recitals and Findings.

- 1.01. The District has received a petition from the Yellowstone Club requesting the addition of certain lands to the District, which petition has been determined and certified to meet the requirements of the Title 7, Chapter 7, Parts 22 and 23, Montana Code Annotated.
- 1.02. After a public hearing on the proposed addition to the District duly noticed and held on September 27, 2001, the Board determined that the addition of the land to the District, as requested in the petition, in the best interest of the District.
- 1.03. Section 7-13-2341, Montana Code Annotated, requires that he District grant the petition by adoption of an ordinance, which ordinance must be submitted to the electors of the District as well as to the electors of the proposed addition.
- Section 2. <u>Addition of the Property</u>. The boundaries of the District are hereby modified to include the following property:

Certain lands within Gallatin County, Montana lying within Sections 28 (Lone Moose Meadows) and 34 (Spanish Peaks), Township 6 South, Range 3 East; Sections 3, 4, 9 and 10, Township 7 South, Range 3 East; and certain lands in Madison County, Montana lying within Section 5, Township 7 South, Range 3 East.

Section 3. Effect of the Addition of Property to the District. Upon the filing of the certificate of approval of the Ordinance, the territory described above (the "Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition") shall be a part of the District and shall be included in the both the Water System Jurisdictional Area and the Sewer System Jurisdictional Area and shall be subject to all the rules, regulations, ordinance fees, charges, taxes levied or imposed against other property of the District exclusive of the Sewer Impact Fee as provided in the agreement between the District and Yellowstone Club, and posses the rights, privileges and powers set forth in Title 7, Chapter 13, Part 22 and 23, Montana Code Annotated.

Section 4. <u>Submission to the Electorate; Calling of the Election</u>. The Board of the District hereby calls and directs a special election to be held by mail ballot for the purpose of voting on whether to approve or reject the Ordinance of the Board adding the Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition to the District.

Section 5. Conduct of Election. All qualified electors of the District and the qualified electors of the Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition shall be entitled to vote on the Ordinance. For purposes of this election, the qualified electors include those registered electors owning or residing upon real property in the District and the Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition, or in the case of property owned by a corporation, the president, vice president or secretary of the corporation who shall be a registered elector. The Secretary of the District is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the call and details of this election to the County Election Administrator and request that the election be held as soon as is practicable and/or in conjunction with the District's water and sewer system bond elections. The County Election Administrator is requested to give notice of the close of registration and thereafter prepare printed lists of the qualified electors in the District and the Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition entitled to vote in the election in the District and the Lone Moose Meadows and Spanish Peaks Addition and to conduct the election in the form and manner prescribed by law and consistent with an approve plan.

Section 6. <u>Notice of Election</u>. The County Election Administrator is hereby authorized and requested to cause notice of the call and holding of the election to be given not less than once a week for three consecutive weeks prior to the election by publishing notice in the *Lone Mountain Lookout and the Madisonian*, newspapers of general circulation in Gallatin County. The notice of election as published shall read substantially as shown on Exhibit A hereto (which is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof).

Section 7. Form of Ballot. The ballot shall be printed in substantially the form as shown on Exhibit B hereto (which is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof).

Section 8. <u>Instructions to Secretary; Filing</u>. If the Ordinance is approved, the President and Secretary of the Board are hereby directed to certify that fact to the Secretary of State and the County Clerk and Recorder and request that the Secretary of State issue a certificate that the Ordinance has been approved and the territory has been added to the District. The Secretary of State shall transmit the certificate to the County Clerk and Recorder for filing, upon which the territory is deemed added to the District.
